Dear Dr. Beltrán :

The purpose of this letter is to make a request to Kellogg Foundation for financing a group fellowship for 8 academic and clinical nurses of the Faculty of Medicine to visit teaching/service integration projects and community health education programs in other countries.

Colombia

- Bucaramanga : School of Nursing of the Universidad Industrial de Santander : its Kellogg project that emphasizes teaching/service integration.

- Guanajuato : visit MENIVICA project and teaching/service integration project of Leon.


One of the participants of this fellowship is planning to extend her stay in order to visit health selfcare and primary health programs at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and at the School of Public Health in Amherst, Massachusetts.

The University of Zulia will pay the travel expenses Santiago-Maracaibo-Santiago and the per diems during the stay in Maracaibo for two of the participants.

The financial aid required from Kellogg Foundation to make this group fellowship possible is US\$ 24.864.- (twenty four thousand eight hundred and sixty four dollars).
